While traveling in Rome, Florence, and Venice one should always be aware of where their passports, credit cards, and cash is at all times. There are people in Italy who make pick-pocketing their career – and a very well-paid one at that.

I found out the hard way that there are indeed pick-pocketers in Italy, and might I add, very good pick-pocketers. Usually, I have my passport holder (which is a wallet on a string that you wear around your neck and under your clothes), containing my passport, credit cards, travel tickets and cash, around my neck and out of sight. I was not quite panicking at this moment, so I started digging through my bag, and low and behold, they got my passport holder containing my cash, credit cards and of course my only proof of U.S citizenship, my passport. It was at this moment that I began to panic.

When in Rome... and when losing your passport...

Don't panic! I panicked for about 30 seconds, and then I realized I have a few things that I need to take care of. First thing's first: cancel your credit cards! If they use your credit cards, chances are they will use them immediately after they steal your items. Next, you need to report your stolen passport to the police. This will make reissuing your passport much easier.

In order to get a new passport, you need to go to the U.S. Embassy. I was lucky and there was a small embassy in Florence, otherwise I would have had to take a three hour train ride to Rome, take a cab to the embassy and sit there all day, and maybe even the next to get my new passport.

The key to convenience when traveling outside of the country is to make sure that you have a copy of your passport that you keep at the hotel, carry your passport with you at all times (around your neck) and always be aware of your surroundings, but most of all: enjoy your trip! For further advice, never bet your students that they will get pick-pocketed before you because that is a for sure "foot in mouth" mistake (and not only did I lose my cash in Italy, but then I was out \$45 U.S. to my students when we got home!). Also never make announcements such as "This is a popular hang out for pick-pocketers" or "Make sure you have your passports around your neck" in crowded areas, because that is when they are going to strike.

But most of all, take advantage of having the opportunity to travel. I will never forget my trip to Italy, not only because of the wonderful passport incident, but also because of the incredible sights and the amazing experience I had!

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
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
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experiences roller coaster

reach of even...


The shadows darkness

review smackdown v. raw

Smackdown v. Raw 2006 is one of the best wrestling games since Smackdown HCTP (Here comes the pain). The gameplay is the same as last years you press the circle button to execute a multiple of different moves to inflict damage on your opponent. The new and latest addition to SvR2006 is the stamina system; it prolongs the match and makes it much more fun and difficult if you are playing with another player. The stamina system allows players to get a feel like a real wrestling match. The players' stamina is fully charged. During a match big moves like powerbombs, full nelson slams and other types of powerful moves will begin to deplete your stamina making your wrestler lose stamina, which result in him being much slower in the match. If both players keep losing stamina simultaneously both players will drop in the middle of the ring and the referee will begin to count, and there will be a mini game that you have to accomplish so that you can regain your stamina. It is a really fun new addition to SvR2006. There is also a new momentum system in the game. In other Smackdown games you can keep doing moves over and over again hit your special and win the match. In this year's SvR2006 it is not like that anymore.

With the brand new momentum system, if you do the same move type over and over again the crowd will get bored and your momentum will go up but not as fast as you would want it to, so you will have to do a variety of different moves so that your momentum will rise and you could finally reach a special. Another brand new system in this year's SvR2006 is the submission system. It is still the same as last year's button mashing to make your opponent tap is still here

in this year's. But it makes it much easier for people like me who are not good with the fast button mashing. In this year's SvR2006 all you have to do is make the green bar end in the blue bar. There is some submissions that you will be able to reverse and to accomplish that you have to end the green bar in the red bar. But it's won't be as easy because your opponent will be adding pressure to the designated spot and you won't be able to always hit it in the right places. All of these new additions will give the players' a feel of a real WWE match, and you will have to use strategy which is fun.

All of last year's match types are here like single, tag-team, and hell in a cell. The game developers at Yukes decided to add in some new matches, that gamers have been anticipating. There is a fulfill your Fantasy Match, I personally don't really like the match and don't know why Yukes added it but that still doesn't take away from the excitement of the game. My favorite match that is new in the game is the Buried Alive match. The name may strike some people, but like the name says you are trying to bury your opponent alive. Yukes finally put it in the game and that makes me happy because I've wanted it since the first smackdown game for the PS2.

The season mode is better and I really like it. You can go through season as a wrestler and there are multiple storylines. If you create a wrestler and want to take him through season they finally have voices you can choose from which makes the season all the better. Every wrestler has a voice also the voice acting has gotten better than last year's game. The commentators have much more to say also during a match about a wrestler and can be funny at times.
